### ***Merrimack Skate Park (Merrimack, New Hampshire)***

The Merrimack Parks & Recreation Department would like to announce that the Skateboard Park will be open April – October as weather permits. The Park will be closed if raining or if the elements are wet for safety reasons. During school vacation the Skateboard Park will follow the summer schedule of 11:00am – 8:00pm. Please contact the Merrimack Parks & Recreation Dept. at 882-1046 with any questions or concerns.

#### Skate Park Rules

- NO ONE PERMITTED UNLESS ATTENDANT IS ON DUTY.
- Use of safety equipment such as helmets, gloves, knee and elbow pads, wrist supports, and proper shoes is strongly recommended.
- No glass containers, food or beverage allowed on the skating surface (spills jeopardize the skaters).
- No other items such as benches, tables, wood materials or other objects used as ramps or jumps are allowed in the Skate Park. No modifications to existing ramps permitted.
- No drugs, alcohol, or tobacco products will be permitted.
- No loud music or disorderly behavior will be permitted.
- No pets are allowed in the Skate Park.
- No skating or biking against traffic on ramps or units.
- Do not proceed down a ramp until it is clear of other skaters.
- No littering. Please use the trashcans.
- ANY UNRULY ACTION SUCH AS FIGHTING AND SWEARING IS PROHIBITED. DISRUPTIVE, DANGEROUS, OR DETRIMENTAL BEHAVIOR WILL NOT BE TOLERATED.
- Any disobeying instructions of the attendant or the above rules will be subject to criminal penalty. The attendant is authorized to eject any persons from the premises for violation of the above rules or for just cause.
- Merrimack Parks & Recreation Department Reserves the Right To:
  - Close the facility for any circumstances deemed necessary.
  - Restrict entry to the facility and to ask persons to leave the facility if any of the rules are not followed or inappropriate behavior is observed.

### ***Skate Park Rules and Regulations (Phoenix, Arizona)***

City of Phoenix skate parks are skate-at-your-own-risk facilities. They are not supervised. Skateboards are limited to a maximum length of 34 inches. Desert West is a skateboards-only park. Both In-line skates and skateboards are permitted at Paradise Valley and Pecos.

- Protective equipment should be used at all times. Use of the skate parks may expose the user to serious injury including broken bones, paralysis or death. P
- Please inspect skating surfaces before beginning and remove any trash or debris that may prevent a smooth, safe ride. Do not skate on any damaged surfaces and report damage at Paradise Valley by calling (602) 262-6696, at Desert West by calling (602) 495-3700 and Pecos by calling (602) 534-9281.
- Bicycles, motorized vehicles, go-peds, rollerskates or other wheeled devices are not permitted in the skate parks.
- Additional ramps, jumps or obstacles are not allowed in the skate parks. No modifications to the skating surfaces or features are allowed. Please restrict skating to features specifically designed for that purpose.

***Skate Park Rules (Stockton, California)***

WARNING: Skateboarding and skating are hazardous recreational activities. Use of this facility may result in death, paralysis, brain damage, concussion, broken bones, or other serious injury. Any use is at your own risk. The City of Stockton does not assume any responsibility for injuries.

All users are required to wear helmets and kneepads. (Chapter 5, Division 3, Section 5-022.10 of the Stockton Municipal Code).

All skaters will be asked to abide by the following:

- Skateboards and skates ONLY. NO bicycles or foot traffic.
- Please observe park hours.
- Please keep noise to a minimum.
- Protect your skate park from graffiti and abuse. The park will be CLOSED for graffiti removal.
- Keep food and/or drinks off the skating surface.
- No glass in or around skating area.
- Additional obstacles or other materials (ramps/jumps) may not be used at the skate park.
- Do not use facility if a hazardous condition exists. Report any damage to the City of Stockton Parks and Recreation Department, 937-7396.
- All organized events shall have written approval from the Director of the City of Stockton Parks and Recreation Department.

***Skate Park Rules and Regulations (Baltimore County, Maryland)***

Skate At Your Own Risk

1. Park open during posted hours. No loitering after facility is closed.
2. Skating/skateboarding at your own risk.
3. All skaters/skateboarders must have a registration card and provide their own skating equipment.
4. Any member caught using another member's registration card to gain access to the Skate Park will be subject to immediate termination from skating privileges.
5. Safety equipment must be worn at all times. This includes a helmet, knee and elbow pads. Closed toed hightop non-slick shoes, gloves, wrist braces and hip pads are encouraged, but not required.
6. Any and all types of bikes and scooters prohibited in the fenced area.
7. In the event of an emergency or injury, all skaters/skateboarders must discontinue skating until further directed by County staff.
8. No food, beverages or smoking allowed in the fenced area.
9. No destroying or defacing public property.
10. Skaters/skateboarders must follow the direction of the County staff at all times. County staff's decision is final.
11. Recklessness, horseplay, foul language, not listening to County staff or any inappropriate behavior will not be tolerated, and will subject you to removal from the park.
12. County staff reserves the right to limit the number of skaters/skateboarders using the facility to prevent overcrowding.

Infractions of the above rules may result in the loss of Skate Park Card and all skating/skateboarding privileges.
